Camp 2025 Theme - Norse Mythology

Guess what - Viking Vinland will be returning to Camp 2025!

In addition to our typical classes - Rosemaling, Hardanger, Ethnic Cooking, Swedish Weaving, etc. - We will once again be offering the following classes (E-Adult).

Tablet Weaving

Tablet weaving (often card weaving in the United States) is a weaving technique where tablets or cards are used to create the shed through which the weft is passed. Most tablet weavers produce narrow work such as belts, straps, or garment trims. In this course, you will learn how to weave and be introduced to the historical supplies used, while using easier to obtain modern materials to create your own tablet woven belt or decorative trim.





Pottery



In this class, we will introduce you to making pottery the way the Vikings did - No pottery wheels or expensive tools - but instead by using the coiling method. This class will supply you with enough clay to make your own viking age pottery cup. You can then air dry your cup, or it can be fired in an open fire - depending on the weather.







Clothing Making / Embroidery





In this class, you are introduced to pattern drafting and Viking age clothing making. You may create either a Viking age Tunic style shirt, or a Viking age dress for everyday wear. We will help you draft your pattern for this item of clothing, and assist you to sew that item. Sewing machines are supplied, but the number of these machines are limited and it may help to bring our own if you have one!

Please Note: Materials supplied for this course are limited. If you are wanting to make a piece of clothing in a certain colour or with a specific fabric you may need to supply your own.

Leatherworking



Birka bags

For Leatherworkers of all skill levels - Learn to create an impressive pouch based on archeological finds from birka. This belt pouch is a beautiful leather bag, made to hang on your belt and hold things close. The leather for this pouch is pre-cut, but you will have to learn to assemble the pouch, and create your own stitch marks using a leatherworking awl. This course comes with all the materials to create one pouch.







Pottery



In this class, we will introduce you to making pottery the way the Vikings did - No pottery wheels or expensive tools - but instead by using the coiling method. This class will supply you with enough clay to make your own viking age pottery cup. You can then air dry your cup, or it can be fired in an open fire - depending on the weather.

Drop spinning

A hands on tutorial to drop spindle spinning for complete beginners. You will learn everything you need to know from attaching the fiber, to finishing your yarn! This course comes with a drop spindle, and 100 grams of raw wool to begin spinning.

Norwegian Idiom:

Å ta beina på nakken

Translation: To put your legs on your neck.

Meaning: To run away from something.









The University of Oslo has recently launched the <u>Great Viking Survey</u>, a wide-ranging study to explore how people across the world perceive and engage with the vikings as history and heritage, and to map the many ways in which contemporary media and academia shape these views. This online survey invites anyone, anywhere, over 18, to share their thoughts on the iconic viking warrior figure, as well as the enduring legacy and memory of the vikings in the modern world. In doing so, researchers will be able to shine an unprecedented light on the means and mechanisms that allow images and myths of the vikings to be shaped and spread in the public sphere.

The survey is part of the <u>Making a Warrior-project</u>, a pan-Nordic network of scholars examining the concept of viking 'warriorhood' and its representations past and present. By determining how ideas and images of vikings are shared among different communities and demographics, the project is able inform future outreach and cultural heritage initiatives that respond to public interest, while fostering a nuanced appreciation of the Viking Age.

The Great Viking Survey is now live at <u>vikingsurvey.org</u>, and remains open until mid-May 2025. The associated press release from the University of Oslo can be found <u>here</u>.

Recipe:

DESCRIPTION

Rømmegrøt is a wonderful Norwegian classic dish that is warming, rich, and delicious. A rustic porridge recipe that is amped up with great ingredients like cream, sugar, butter, and flavor!

INGREDIENTS

2 cups heavy cream 1 cup whole milk ½ cup flour 2 Tablespoons sugar 1 teaspoon salt

FOR TOPPING

Melted butter Sugar Cinnamon

INSTRUCTIONS

- 1. Heat milk just to a boil and then remove from heat. Stir to make sure milk does not scald.
- 2. While doing this, add cream to medium saucepan and bring to a simmer. Stir continually to ensure the dairy does not scald.
- 3. Allow to simmer while stirring for 5 minutes.
- 4. Slowly add flour to cream and stir in with fork. Add about 2 Tablespoons at a time
- 5. Once flour is fully incorporated, add 2 Tablespoons of sugar, salt, and stir in.
- 6. Slowly add in hot milk and stir at the same time until evenly mixed.
- 7. Put in dish, top with butter, sugar, and cinnamon. Serve.
